Savannah River Site federal employees exceed fundraising goal for Combined Federal Campaign

AIKEN, S.C. (Feb. 10, 2017) – The U.S. Department of Energy (DOE), Savannah River Site (SRS) presented a check to the Combined Federal Campaign (CFC) of the Central Savannah River Area (CSRA) on January 30 in the amount of \$131,403.28, exceeding the campaign goal by more than \$11,000.

The CFC is the annual workplace giving opportunity for federal employees. Department of Energy - Savannah River (DOE-SR) Manager Jack Craig credits SRS employees with the success of this year's campaign.

"The tremendous support of the SRS federal workforce, demonstrates their desire to improve the lives of people in the CSRA, the nation and the world," said Craig.

Doug Dearolph, DOE Manager for the National Nuclear Security Administration's Savannah River Field Office, who presented the check on behalf of Craig, said the success of this year's campaign could not have been achieved without the generosity of so many at SRS.

Federal agencies at SRS participating in this year's campaign include the Department of Energy-Savannah River Operations Office, the National Nuclear Security Administration, the Office of the Inspector General and the U.S. Forest Service.

This year's campaign was led by DOE-SR CFC Chair Pam Marks and Co-Chair Rachel Zoss. The campaign began Sept. 1, 2016 with the goal of raising \$120,000 for the thousands of participating local, national and international charities. The campaign ended Dec. 31, 2016.

CFC is the world's largest and most successful annual workplace charity campaign, with almost 200 CFC campaigns throughout the country and overseas raising millions of dollars each year.
